INTRODUCTION

The highest education is that which does not merely give us information but makes our life in harmony with all existence.

Gurudev

The largest of trees has its origin in the tiniest of seeds. The sweetest of flowers has a modest beginning in the small bud. One small step of Armstrong on the moon has been a giant leap for humanity. Every historic milestone has its beginning in the apparently simplest of actions. The history of mankind has repeatedly bourn testimony to this truth. The history of Prabhat Kumar College, Contai, one of the premier institutes of repute in the state, is no exception.

The high tide of the Bengal Renaissance may have been more perceptible on the national front with the struggle for independence gaining the ultimate momentum, but its spirit had spiralled into every nook and corner of Bengal. The final shaping force came in the form of the Gandhian whirlwind that swept across the country in the 1920s and this southernmost sub-division of Bengal was graced by his auspicious visit in 1925.

The torch of nationalist fervour that he carried provided the much-needed fire to the patriotic zeal of noble souls of the area and touched the chord of the magnanimous humanist Late Babu **Biswambhar Dinda**, a benevolent Zamindar of the locality. Yet to completely recover from the shock of the untimely death of his only son, late Prabhat Kumar Dinda, at the tender age of twenty, the big heart was still yearning with the burning desire of 'doing' something great for the spread of education in the area and he came forward with a princely donation of `44,527/- to the college fund and left a will bequeathing his whole property to a Board of Trustees with a direction to spend half the annual income from the property for maintenance and development of the college. He continued to be the guiding spirit of the college as the life-member and secretary of the college

till his death in May 1937. Initially the college was being run in a portion of the oldest education institute of the sub-division, Contai High School.

That was the beginning and, as they say, the rest is history. The initiative taken by the humanist Late Babu **Biswambhar Dinda**, brought together, in its strides, so many humanists of the area that within a very short period the organisers of the college got the support of late Rai Saheb Gangadhar Nanda of Mugberia, a munificent landlord contributing `10,000/- for this noble mission. Besides rendering the pecuniary help, they secured a plot of land, a little over an acre, as gift from Mahanta Badrinarayan Das.

The college was yet to have its own premises. As late as in 1937, during the period of Founder Principal Nepal Chandra Roy, the college authority purchased a plot of land measuring about 5.7 acre with a moderate building from the American Baptist, Bengal, Orissa Mission, at a very modest price of `3700 and the college was shifted there (which also happens to be its present location) on 26th August, 1937. One room was erected on the top of the college building and another with a veranda was also built up by the Trust Board during session 1940-41 and named "Biswambhar Hall" in memory of the principal donor, Biswambhar Dinda. In course of time the college authority got fifty bighas of land either by purchase or by acquisition.

The college that set sail as an Arts college in 1926 under the aegis of University of Calcutta, initially with only thirty nine (39) students has now developed into a full-fledged multi-disciplinary one with roll strength of about five thousand students, now affiliated to the Vidyasagar University. The college started B.A., I. Sc., and B. Sc. in the years of 1940, 1947, and 1954, respectively. Along with the march of time the Institution is also marching ahead by opening up new horizons of study to cater to the needs of students to meet the challenges on the frontiers of education in the twenty-first century. Right now, the college offers Honours Programmes in Twenty (20) subjects, General programmes in twenty two (22) subjects, Post-Graduate Programmes in six subjects (Physics, Chemistry, Bengali, English, Sanskrit, Commerce), BCA and Teachers' Training (B.Ed.) programme that resumed after a gap of few years.

The history of this institution would remain incomplete without a reference to the contribution of late Satish Chandra Dinda to the growth and prosperity of the college. He was at the helm of the affairs in college for a long time as Secretary and the college under his visionary leadership weathered many storms and attained a great name and fame in the annals of education in our country. The Founder Principal Nepal Chandra Roy joined this college on 19th July, 1926 and retired on 13th December, 1957. He was well known as an able administrator, draconic disciplinarian and a true teacher in Mathematics. During his long tenure of selfless service he left no stone unturned in bringing about all-round development. Both in the University of Calcutta and the Department of Education, Govt. of W.B., the Institution was held in high esteem because of its progress and performance. Right from Principal Roy to the present Principal, Dr. Amit Kumar De, the college has been fortunate to have excellent administrators at the helm of office who have taken the college to new heights of glory. Their efforts would not have been successful but for the tireless efforts put in by the galaxy of teachers who have rendered and still continue to render their valuable contribution to academic excellence. The Governing Body, undaunted in its effort to keep up the glory of the institute, a dedicated support staff and a very constructive Students' Union are harmonizing well with the efforts put in by the Teacher-in-Charge and the teaching community of the college to translate of the dream of the founder(s) to reality.

The Institution in its continual effort towards quality improvement volunteered for Second Cycle Assessment by National Assessment & Accreditation Council (NAAC) of University Grants Commission (UGC) in 2014-15 session and was satisfactorily assessed & accredited with B Grade (CGPA 2.76). The college in its stride over nine decades has played a glorious and significant role as the harbinger of the light that higher education radiates. Drawing sustenance from tireless and united toil of dedicated teachers, devoted employees and innumerable students, well mentored by an equally zealous Governing Body, it has secured the present stature of a premier degree college in West Bengal. Attainment of

such laudable status inevitably entails upon the institution the responsibility of maintaining and improving upon the same.

We know that even our best attempts may appear just too little and 'petty' compared to the 'undone vast' and we have 'miles to go'.

AIMS AND OBJECTIVES

The goals and objectives of the institution is stated in the logo of the college – - a great Vedic hymn meaning **inculcation of that education which liberates the mind**. The college in its journey of almost nine decades has tirelessly attempted to impart, promote and spread education to students in this southern part of the state of West Bengal. The college aims at maintaining a good academic standard and integration of diverse cultural, social and religious groups in a platform of equality and friendly environment.

Coupled with the Upanishadic utterance mentioned in the logo, the academic vision of the college is guided by the great saying of Swami Vivekananda – "Education is the manifestation of the perfection already in man." Our vision is to promote and spread that kind of education that not only offers knowledge, but also arranges for its cultivation and flowering in a natural yet orderly fashion, leading to the development of a society founded on love, mutual respect and humane understanding. And thus to reach a stage, envisaged by Gurudev,

It is a matter of pride for all of us that during the last years no teaching day has been lost for campus violence or student agitation and that there has been no instance of ragging or violation of the modesty of women in the campus.

A. COLLEGE CAMPUS

The total area of the College Campus is about 18 acres, for the most part encircled by the boundary walls. Trees of different species keep the campus green and eco-friendly. The pleasant atmosphere of the campus creates an ideal ambience for teaching and learning. The total completed built up area taking all floors is 10441.2 sq. Mtrs.

B. COLLEGE BUILDINGS

The old building of the college bespeaks the heritage of this 88-year old institution. The core campus has four blocks housing the Administrative Section, Natural Sciences Section, Humanities & Social Sciences Section and the Central Library. Outside the core campus, the Departments of B.Ed., Computer Science (Hons.) including BCA, Economics and Physical Education are located in Prof. N. C. Roy Block. Birendranath Sasmal Block houses Zoology, Anthropology & Computer Hardware Lab. The 'Rasbehari Pal Building' has the Study Centres of Distance Education (VU & RBU) and Open Learning (NSOU) as the important wing of the college. With assistance from the State Government, a new PG block is coming up.

C. HOSTEL ACCOMODATION

The College has well-equipped Girls' and Boys' Hostels. In February, 2014, a new four-storied Girls' Hostel with UGC assistance has been inaugurated. The Boys' hostel has been shifted to a more spacious building with increased accommodation and better amenities. A student after his/her admission in the college may apply to the superintendent of respective Hostels seeking admission to the Hostel. The application forms will be available from the cashier of General section. Hostel accommodation is provided to selected students depending on the distance between their places of residence and the institution. The details of fees to be paid by an intending student (Boys' & Girls' Hostel) are given below:

i) Seat Rent (including electricity)

Rs. 400.00 (Per Month)

ii) Admission fee Rs. 100.00 (Per Year)

D. CONTAI P. K. COLLEGE ALUMNI ASSOCIATION:

Contai P. K. College Alumni Association is an integral part of this age-old institution and was formed during the 75th year celebration of this college in April, 2002. The same is a registered Non-Government and non-profit seeking organization.

Since then the association is undertaking various social and cultural pursuits for the benefit of the present students and also co-operating the college authorizes in the all round development of the Alma matter.

The Association organizes lectures, debates, discussions, seminars etc. for diffusion of knowledge in the various fields of education and culture. It also arranges Health Check up camp, Blood Donation camp and Thalassemia Detection camp from time to time for the benefit of the current students and staff. It also gives valuable suggestion and helps the college to overcome the various problems.

E. ANICILLARY ACTIVITIES:

The college arranges annual cultural competition and cultural programmes with active participation of Students' Union under the supervision of teachers. The college celebrates the Foundation day, Founder's birth day, National Youth Day, republic Day, Independence Day, International Mother Tongue Day and National Science Day. Students also participate in University level, State level, National and International level cultural competition and some of them make grand success.

F. DISCIPLINE:

No Student shall:

- By words, spoken or written, or by signs or visible representation, offend or insult a fellow student or any teacher of the college or any employee of office or authority of the university.
- ii. Misappropriate, destroy, mutilate, disfigure or otherwise damage any College or University property in particular furniture, books, apparatus etc.
- iii. Disobey any order issued by the University or by the Principal / Teacher-in-Charge of this college or any rule or order for the time being in force in University or College.
- 2. If a student is found guilty of the breach of discipline if he/she breaks any of the foregoing rules or is otherwise guilty of misconduct or indecorous behaviour, he/she will be penalized by the college authority.
- **3.** For a breach of discipline within or outside the premises of the college, the Principal / Teacher-in-Charge of the college may.
 - a) Impose a fine on a student,
 - b) Suspend the student for one month or more,
 - c) Expel him / her from the college for such period as it thinks fit.
- **4.** Principal or Teacher-in-Charge may, without assigning any reason, require a student to leave the College if he/she considers such action necessary in the

- interest of the institution. It shall not be open to students in such cases to ask for the reason.
- **5. Grievance Redressal Cell**: There is a well-organized Cell to dispose of the complaints made by the Students, Guardians, Non-teaching staff & Teaching staff of the college.
- 6. Women's Cell for Redressal of Complaints of Sexual Harassment of Women in workplace: The college being a co-educational college of undergraduate and postgraduate studies, the authority takes a *Zero-Tolerance Approach* to sexual harassment of women in the campus. In compliance with the UGC circulars from time to time the college authority has set up a **Visakha Cell** and a committee and developed guidelines to combat sexual harassment and violence against women in the campus. The Cell not only takes care of complaints of sexual harassment of working women in the Campus but also widens its scope to prevent any incident of violation of the modesty of any woman (students, staff, guardians, visitors).
- 7. Anti-ragging Cell: The College authority takes a *Zero-Tolerance* Approach to Ragging in any form in the campus. In compliance with the UGC Regulations on Curbing the Menace of Ragging in Higher Educational Institutions, 2009 (under Section 26 (1) (g) of the University Grants Commission Act, 1956) the College authority has constituted a Anti-ragging Cell to monitor any case of ragging in the College campus. At the time of admission every student has to provide an undertaking
 - Ragging in any from is totally prohibited in the Campus.
 - Ragging is a serious crime and is punishable by law. Anyone found indulging in ragging will face severe punishment from the Authority.
