Programme Specific Outcomes

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Course Code	Course Name	Course Outcome
PLSHCC01	Understanding Political Theory	To understand and be able to interrelate the leading Political Theory, Methods, Approaches, International Relations, Comparative Politics and approaches in the subfields of Indian government. It gives the full-phased knowledge regarding the theory of political science.
PLSHCC02	Constitutional Government and Democracy in India	To Know how laws are made, policies are developed, programs implemented and what influences and constrains are placed upon the process. This course acquaints students with the constitutional design of state structures and institutions, and their actual working over time. The course traces the embodiment of some of these conflicts in constitutional provisions, and shows how these have played out in political practice in democracy. It further encourages a study of state institutions in their mutual interaction, and in interaction with the larger extra-constitutional environment.
PLSHCC03	Political Theory – Concepts and Debates	It helps us to equip ourselves with the analytical tools necessary to differentiate between legitimate functions of government and the arbitrary use of power. It enables the readers to move beyond the apparent truths regarding what is happening in politics. The study of political theory provides precision to our knowledge of the fundamental yet General political concepts like liberty, equality, democracy, development, human rights, justice, etc. it describes all these fields and takes up the evolving new sets of ideas and debates that form the core of political theory. These debates and concepts give new insights into the critical frame of understanding and interpreting politics.
PLSHCC04	Political Process in India	Political process in India is an attempt to grapple with the dynamics of politics. Personality-oriented political analysis is inadequate to explain the currents of politics. Politics of Communalism in India has been analyzed by linking them with the role of political parties, elections and social forces which shape politics. Political parties play a crucial role and democratic politics cannot be understood without an analysis of parties. In this study, political and their role has been critically examined.
PLSHCC05	Introduction to Comparative Government and Politics	The comparative and government politics class shows how comparing different governments helps identify problems, and how one can analyze government to come up with solutions to serious political problems. By looking at how counties use policies to try and solve problems, students come up with useful knowledge on government and how it operates. The problems studied include high birth rates, crime, corruption, growth, poverty, overpopulation, etc. Students are able to compare how effective one government system is in identifying and trying to solve the problem compared to another, or how the problem was made worse. It focuses on the processes and outcomes

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		countries use to set up, elect, and run governments.
PLSHCC06	Perspectives on Public Administration	The Public Administration embraces all the activities of the government. Hence, as an activity the scope of public administration is no less than the scope of state activity. In the modern welfare state people, expect many things- a wide variety of services and protection from the government. In this context, public administration provides a number of welfare and social security services to the people. Besides, it has to manage government owned industries and regulate private industries. Public administration covers every area and activity within the ambit public policy. Thus, the scope of public administration is very wide in modern state.
PLSHCC07	Perspectives on International Relations and World History	In this lesson, student will be looking at some of the theoretical approaches involved in international relations. International relations, of course, is the study of how nation-states interact with one another within an international system. As student can imagine, there is a lot of room here for differences of opinion. The study of International Relations has therefore become highly useful and enlightening for students and others alike.
PLSHCC08	Political Processes and Institutions in Comparative Perspective	In this course, students will be trained in the application of comparative methods to the study of politics. The course is comparative in both what we study and how we study. In the process, the course aims to introduce undergraduate students to some of the range of issues, literature, and methods that cover comparative political.
PLSHCC09	Public Policy and Administration in India	It provides an insight into the management of affairs of the government at all levels-national, state and local. This will also help us to understand: how human and material resources can be used to reach its desired goals. This course will also highlight the formulation and implementation of public policies, organizational structures and machinery of administration as well as administrative practices. Moreover, it addresses a relationship between government, organizations and its environment. This course will help the students to understand the key themes, debates, and socio-political significance of issues, which are influencing the study of Public Administration. It will be of interest to even students of other disciplines, like law, history, sociology etc. It is not only useful for Under Graduate students but is also important for research scholars and students who are appearing for competitive examinations.
PLSHCC10	Global Politics	The global politics course explores fundamental political concepts such as power, equality, sustainability, and peace in a range of contexts and at a variety of levels.

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PLSHCC11	Classical Political Philosophy	The course is an introduction to the development of Western political philosophy from Plato to Rousseau. It is concerned with an examination of the most important ideas and theories concerning the relationship between man, state and society in the political thought of the Ancient Greeks, the early Christians, the later Middle Ages, and the early modern state. Student can learn that the classical Political philosophy, also known as political theory, is the study of topics such as politics, liberty, justice, property, rights, law, and the enforcement of laws by authority: what they are, if they are needed, what makes a government legitimate, what rights and freedoms it should protect, what form it should take, what the law is, and what duties citizens owe to a legitimate government, if any, and when it may be legitimately overthrown, if ever.
PLSHCC12	Indian political Thought - I	This course focuses in detail on the political discourse and the actual functioning of the Indian political thought process. It simultaneously studies in detail the political philosophy & structure from Ancient to Modern India. In doing this it elaborately deals with the prominent political ideologue of India i.e. Bharat. This course shows that how their thought process had been controlled by local influences & time frame and critically assesses its impact on political functioning. The major contradictions of the different Political thoughts are to be seriously analyzed along with as assessment of their successes and failures.
PLSHCC13	Modern Political Philosophy	Modern Indian political thought is one of the fascinating areas of scholarly debates and discussions in contemporary India. It also signifies a shift away from excessive reliance upon Eurocentric views, methods and concepts to study and interpret Indian society and its politics. The major objective of this course is to introduce the students to some of the key modern Indian thinkers and their ideas, which helped in shaping the society and politics of modern India.
PLSHCC14	Indian Political Thought - II	It gives the full-phased knowledge regarding in detail on the political discourse and the actual functioning of the Indian political thought process. This course critically assesses the contribution of the modern Indian political thinkers. It emphasizes on the distinctive contribution of Indian thinkers to political theorizing as well as in the making of modern India. It simultaneously studies in detail the political philosophy & structure from Ancient to Modern India. In doing this it elaborately deals with the prominent political ideologue of India i.e. Bharat. This course shows that how their thought process had been controlled by local influences & time frame and critically assesses its impact on political functioning. The major contradictions of the different Political thoughts are to be seriously analyzed along with as assessment of their successes and failures.

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PLSHGE01	Development Process and Social Movements in Contemporary India	It gives the full- phase's knowledge regarding Indian social structure and its relation to development process and different social movement in India.
PLSHGE02	United Nations and Global Conflicts	Student will able to learn about endeavors to look into all changes and challenges, along with a comprehensive examination of the structures, functions and activities of the United Nations. The critical appraisal also attempts to throw light on the various reform efforts within and outside the UN.
PLSHGE03	Women, Power and Politics	Student will able to learn as women continue to gain more prominence in political and electoral processes as voters, candidates, and officeholders, it becomes even more important to understand how gender shapes political power and the distribution of resources within our society.
PLSHGE04	Human Rights in a Comparative Perspective	Student can learn that the Human rights are inherently comparative. Empirical analysis on and advocacy for human rights are grounded in significant questions relating to human well-being and how such well-being varies across units, whether these units are individuals, groups, countries, or regions.
PLSHSEC01	Democratic Awareness with Legal Literacy	The Proposed course aims to acquaint student with the structure and manner of functioning of the legal system in India
PLSHSEC02	Legislative Practices and Procedures	To acquaint the student broadly with the legislative process in India at various levels, introduce them to the requirements of peoples' representatives and provide elementary skills to be part of a legislative support team and expose them to real life legislative work. These will be, to understand complex policy issues, draft new legislation, track and analyze ongoing bills, make speeches and floor statements, write articles and press releases, attend legislative meetings, conduct meetings with various stakeholders, monitor media and public developments, manage constituent relations and handle inter-office communications
