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About the Department

The Department of Economics has its glorious past. The department started its journey in 1957. Presently, the Department has 5 faculty members with teaching and research interests that cover a broad range of areas like microeconomics, macroeconomics, development economics, econometrics, environmental economics, financial economics, health & Education economics and international trade.

The department presently offers: four years B.Sc. Honours in Economics (NEP) and two Multi-Disciplinary Courses (NEP). The departmental teachers also supervise the Ph.D. scholars. Admission for the undergraduate honours program is done through the merit basis. The entry to the Ph.D. program is done as per the University Guidelines (Vidyasagar University) and University Grants Commission (UGC) norms.

- (ii) To make students more equipped with this subject by taking class seminars, class test and by completion of syllabus in due time.
- (iii) To make the knowledge perfect and matured and attain finality, excursion to the places of productions, trade and business are regularly held to supplement their knowledge with practical idea.
- (iv) To work as consultants/mentors by the teachers to help the students to fulfil their dream and to motivate them to become ideal human being.
- (v) To make the students more discipline and punctual, the teachers act as friend, philosopher and guide.
- (vi) To encourage students to take part in extracurricular activities such as sports, NCC, NSS, fine arts, music and other cultural competitions and to do short courses on Computer Training, Communication English to enhance their selfconfidence.



Subject Demand of Economics in this Institution

The demand for the subject of Economics is relatively less as compared to other subjects due to certain factors. Firstly, students from rural and backward areas are less aware about the importance of Economics in building up carrier. Moreover, very few schools offer Economics as their optional subjects. Due to this, job opportunity of this subject in school level is very less. Apart from this, the concentration of industrial belt and social science research unit are also drastically low in Bengal as compared to other states. Students belonging to financially and socially backward section of the society are less interested to go for higher studies and to get job outside the state of West Bengal. All these contribute to the poor demand for the subject of Economics which is reflected in the demand ratio given below.

Mode and Medium of teaching

For teaching purposes, the most common method used by the departmental teachers is PowerPoint presentations. We have one smart classroom and two regular classrooms. In addition to delivering lectures and distributing class notes, students are provided with various web links to access study materials (such as YouTube, the Digital Library, and Google Classroom). Each teacher prepares a semester-wise lesson plan to ensure proper teaching and timely completion of the syllabus. Students are also encouraged to regularly participate in class seminars.

As part of the Internal Assessment (10 marks for each Honours and General paper), we conduct 2 class tests for each Honours paper and 1 class test for each General paper. Additionally, we place a greater emphasis on class seminars, group discussions, etc. After completing the syllabus, the department conducts a final preparatory exam for each semester.

Facilities Available to Ensure Effective Teaching and Learning

A. Physical Facilities:

- i) **Books and Journals:** Central library contains 2040 books of economics. Three journals, namely, Yojana, Kurukhetra and Economic and Political weekly have been subscribed by the authority of the central library.
- ii) **E-learning Facilities**: Our department has one smart class room. Deliberation of lectures with power point presentation (PPT) by the teachers is a common practice.
- iii) **Computer Laboratory**: A well-equipped central computer lab is available for our faculties & students. This facility is very useful to cover our syllabus which contains both project works and computer application.

B. Other Strategies:

- Mentorship: Departmental teachers act as mentors of the students. At the beginning of each academic session, newly admitted students are divided into several groups and each teacher takes the responsibility to act as mentor of the students of each group. Teachers frequently interact with them to know about their problems and suggest suitable measures to solve their problems. This mentorship is indeed a very fruitful to develop a quality relationship between the teachers and the students, which in turn, is expected to ensure effective teaching and learning.
- **Parent-teacher meet:** It is a routine convention of this institution to conduct parent-teacher meets once in a year. Our department also regularly conducts the parent-teacher meets as per the time and date fixed by the parent-teacher meet committee. This year this meet was held on 08-01-2024 (Picture of this meeting attached in photo gallery).
- **Teacher Evaluation:** Teacher evaluation by the students is mandatory in our Department. In this process, the students, without disclosing their identity, evaluate the teachers on the basis of some questions designed by the teachers of the department.

The Head of the department assesses the evaluation sheets and takes suitable steps to improve the teacher's performance in different activities, especially in teaching activities. This process is indeed a unique process to ensure effective teaching and learning.

- **Students Seminar:** Students in our department frequently participate in class-seminar where they choose the seminar topic from their syllabus and deliver lecture. This practice is very helpful for students to acquire knowledge of their subject and also enhance their level of confidence. (Picture Attached in Photo Gallery)
- v) Outreach Programme: As per the syllabus of the university, students are always encouraged to conduct field-based project work. We design our outreach programme in such a way that fulfil the two purposes. These are (a) learning the collection of field-based data and (b) make the people more aware about the various problems like their children education, health etc. Apart from this, students are always encouraged to visit incubation, pre-incubation centre, business start-up centres organised by the Institution's Innovation Council.
